This year we mourned with all the country's families that lost loved ones to COVID-19, and as we move into 2021 with a new look at life, relationships and how important each day is, we reflect on what this year taught us.

It taught us that people matter. It taught us that family is first. We know this in all we do. It taught us that health is very important. It taught us that resilience is key to everything, anytime, anywhere. It taught us that together we can do anything. **These are all the mindset of the Naval Special Warfare community.**

OUR MISSION: To support individual and family readiness through an array of programs specifically targeted to assist the Naval Special Warfare Community in maintaining a resilient, sustainable, and healthy force in this era of persistent conflict and frequent deployments.

OUR VISION: To be the premier provider of benevolent civilian support services to the NSW Communities we serve. This is pursued by collaborating with the leaders in Family Support to better understand the effects of deployment; by frequent analysis to ensure we are meeting current needs; by the delivery of exceptional programs; and by educating and involving the civilian population in support of these elite warriors.

2020 ANNUAL SUMMARY

OUR SCOPE OF SERVICE EMBRACES THREE PILLARS

FAMILIES

Third Location Decompression (TLD) seminars provide the spouse tools to prepare for their service members' return from deployment.

Sisterhood meetings foster community and are opportunities for NSW spouses to connect and discuss topics of shared concern.

Our partnership with **SEALKIDS** provides direct educational diagnostic testing services to address the complexities of a NSW child on the autism spectrum, with special needs, tutoring or struggling with behavioral/emotional difficulties.

Yearly **Family Readiness Group (FRG)** grants are used to increase family unity, provide educational activities and empower peer support and close interaction between NSW families.

Emergency Assistance and immediate access to resources is a critical safety net for a wide assortment of activities and issues that arise for Naval Special Warfare families on short notice.



WARRIORS

Injury and Emergency Assistance is provided to the service member for issues that arise unexpectedly.

SEAL/SWCC Family Graduation Dinners are held at the command before graduation to celebrate and welcome the families into the NSW community.

A private breakfast is provided one week after the completion of **Hell Week** for SEAL Candidates and their significant others.

FALLEN HEROES

Gold Star Family Support includes, but is not limited to, Command memorial service/reception expenses for a fallen service member, family trips to internment sites, holiday gatherings and events for families, assistance with private family foundations and the establishment of memorials.

Children, Teens & Young Adult Bereavement Programs are in the form of an annual summer camp for ages 5-18 years old and long weekend academies for Gold Star teens and young adults.

We host NSW Gold Star families annually for the wreath laying ceremonies in conjunction with **Wreaths Across America** in Arlington and San Diego.

Memorial & Heritage Support is funded by the Foundation in the form of monuments, building and classroom dedications, naming events, and local tributes to our fallen brothers.

SEAL FAMILY FOUNDATION PROGRAMS

Until the COVID shutdown in early March 2020, SEAL Family Foundation was providing the force and families with our regularly scheduled programs focused on family resilience. We were quickly able to shift gears and be flexible with what was needed for the families during this turbulent time.

Our partnership with SEALKIDS allowed us to serve 311 NSW children through 605 individualized grants. We resourced virtual spouse events and when safely allowed, were able to coordinate

proper social distancing family get togethers held in outdoor locations, spouse reintegration seminars on the beach, a month long virtual academy for our Gold Star Teens and provide food and refreshments for the graduating SEAL & SWCC students and leadership during their closed private ceremonies. Financial emergencies and family travel support was granted to those with special circumstances.

At the end of the year, we supported our Gold Star Families in San Diego, CA and Arlington, VA, with a chance to continue to honor their loved ones with our annual Wreaths Across America program events. Although the events looked much different than years past, families had the opportunity to be together and pay tribute to their fallen service members.






PROGRAM FUNDING DISTRIBUTION
