1 FAMILIES

Grants for Family Readiness Groups: FRGs are volunteer-led organizations that serve as a vital network of support for NSW members and their families. FRGs provide a range of resources, from welcome and mentor-ship to social events, and aim to enhance family readiness and resilience within the SEAL community.

Spouse Reintegration Retreats: Help spouses prepare for family reintegration after deployment.

SEALKIDS Partnership: Provides educational diagnostics, tutoring, and support for children with learning or emotional challenges.

Sisterhood Gatherings: Peer-led community events held globally with record-setting attendance in 2024.

Direct Emergency Assistance: Immediate support for travel, housing, therapy, medical care and more.

Injury and Emergency Aid: Critical support for operators facing medical or crisis needs.

Graduation Ceremonies: Hosted over 2,500 family members at SEAL and SWCC events.

Hell Week Support: Recognizing and reconnecting SEAL and SWCC candidates with loved ones post-training.



3 FALLEN HEROES

Wreaths Across America: An annual event honoring fallen service members by placing wreaths on their grave. This is part of a nationwide effort to honor, educate, and remember the fallen. In 2024, the SEAL Family Foundation hosted 28 Gold Star spouses and their families at Arlington National Cemetery and 7 families at Fort Rosecrans National Cemetery. By participating in the weekend, SFF provides these families with support and a meaningful opportunity to remember their loved ones.

Army Navy Game: Held the same weekend as Wreaths Across America, SEAL Family Foundation welcomed 13 Gold Star families to experience the time-honored rivalry with special box seating and amenities. This event offered families an opportunity to connect, build community, and share in the spirit of camaraderie during a meaningful weekend of remembrance and pride.

Gold Star Family Support: Covers memorial services, internment travel, holiday events, and remembrance gatherings.
